# MAKE AN AWARENESS POSTER

## **ACTIVITY**

## Time Needed

Up to 3 hours

#### **Materials**

Access to internet
Digital projector
Pens, pencils, markers or paint
Printed worksheet
Poster paper or butcher paper
(\*Could also be a digital poster to display)

# **Activity Description**

Here's how you can help spread the message. Using the <u>fentanyl 6-min video</u> and the <u>Fentapill Fact Sheet</u>, create an awareness poster. You can work as a group or individually. Once completed, place the posters around your school, share them on social media, or use them as part of a larger assembly.

# **Suggested Steps**

- 1. Watch the 6-minute video on Fentanyl, and debrief with the discussion questions.

- 2. Spend time reviewing the **Fentapill Fact Sheet** (find it at <u>bit.ly/fentapill-facts</u>). Use the following prompts to decide the words, phrases, images, and ideas you will use for your poster(s).
  - What sticks out to you the most from the video and the fact sheet?
  - What do you think other students need to know and understand? Select the top 3 facts
  - What elements would go into an effective, attention-grabbing, and informative poster?
  - What do you want other students to learn from your poster? What do you hope they will feel from your poster?
- 3. Design and Produce Your Poster(s)
- 4. Go out and Post Your Poster(s).
- 5. Ask for Feedback.



- After a week or so, ask a selection of students what they thought about your poster(s). Ask them what they remember about them. Each student can survey five other students.
- Debrief what you learned from your surveys.
